Meeting
March 13th 2017**

Present: Garry Kurth, Hope Kurth, Rita Cowan, Ron Cowan, Pastor McKee, Steve Cassan, Linda Williams, Becky Williams and Doug O'Hara

President Garry Kurth called the meeting to order and Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

Correspondence: None reported. (Secretary Jan Barker was not present).

REPORTS:

Financial Secretary: Becky Williams. We received \$1991 in donations and ticket sales for the Pancake Supper. Expenses were \$413. The net profit was \$1578. \$1420 was credited to the General Fund. \$158 was credited into the Missions fund. The 2018 Offering envelopes have been ordered.

Treasurer: The treasurer's report was accepted.

Trustees Report: There was a request to purchase mulch for the prayer beds. The Weight Watchers sign has been fixed. Steve Cassan has mowed the grass. Linda Williams has some extra light bulbs that she will be donating to Peace Lutheran.

SCRIP: March's order was \$1195 with a profit of \$45.12. The check-book balance is \$1600.17. Barbara Meisen requested that July and September SCRIP orders be collected on the second Sunday of those months due to the Fourth of July Holiday and The Labor Day Holiday. Her request was accepted. Rita Cowan posed a question as to what we will do with the SCRIP profits. The council will need to vote on this. It will be brought up at the April 2017 Council meeting.

Elders Report: Bud and Liz Koehlinger were granted a transfer to Ascension Lutheran Church in Tucson, AZ. Bob Owens was granted a peaceful release. We will be receiving Tom and LuAnn Cook as new members.

Pastor's Report: Pastor McKee thanked Garry and Hope Kurth for donating and installing the hot water heater in the front of the church.

OLD BUSINESS: Please see the above notes regarding the Pancake supper in the Financial Secretary's report.

NEW BUSINESS: Hope Kurth made a motion to pay \$60 to the Chamber of Commerce. In return, they will provide our name and any information we provide them to anyone inquiring about a local Lutheran

Church. Ron Cowan seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The rummage sale has been scheduled for April 22 2017 from 8 AM to 2 PM. Thelma Grams will be asked if she is willing to coordinate the rummage sale.

Boomtown Days is scheduled for the same day, so it was decided to skip Boomtown Days this year.

Linda Williams will put up a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board for the Easter Breakfast.

Ron Cowan made a motion to obtain hot water in the Men and Women`s Restrooms. Hope Kurth seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Peace Lutheran has been requested for a donation by Military Bible Sticks. Hope Kurth made a motion for set up a collection for the Bible Sticks. Doug O`Hara seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Spaghetti Supper has been scheduled for May 19 2017. The time is yet to be determined.

The flower shop we use has closed. We will purchase our flowers from "A Floral Occasion" beginning Palm Sunday. The cost will remain the same. (\$20)

Bob Sullivan will no longer be an offering counter. Linda Ryun will be away April and May. Bill Langstaff

and Rosemary Sheehan will begin serving as a counting team for April, May and June.

The meeting closed with the singing of the Doxology.

I wanted to let you know our members have donated a lot of empty inkjet cartridges plus five computers I'm sending out this week! The weight for this box is **47 pounds!** The boxes must be at least 30 pounds, and up to now I've had to take our collections to the St. John's "collector" to add to her packages- (the District still gets the money, but Peace wasn't getting any credit for helping). This time, we have more than enough for our own box- yeah! And Thank you!

As you know, LWML FL-GA District is recycling electronics to raise funds to co-host our 2019 National Convention in Mobile, AL. The District goal is to make about \$7,000. At this point we have made \$4100. The \$25,000 I originally quoted is the total District budget we expect to need toward this convention).

We are collecting *empty inkjet printer cartridges, empty laser printer cartridges, used cell phones, laptops, digital cameras, e-Readers, tablets, GPS systems, and Scientific Calculators (include power cords for everything you donate if you can, please).*

If you are still working, ask if you can take the empty cartridges for your church recycling program. Place your contributions in the inkjet recycling box on the "recycle/info table" in the Fellowship Hall, and we'll take care of them. If your laptop still has the hard drive in it, you can give it directly to me, and I will remove the hard drive and return it to you. Tablets you can reset to factory settings. For cameras, make sure your photo cards are removed.
