As we look forward to God's blessings and care in 2017 I pray that the divisiveness that has taken over our country and in many cases even the church will end. Each day the District office gathers for prayers and devotions. They share these with church workers via email each morning. Last week I was drawn to the day text from Ephesians 4:1-16.

He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held

together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love."

We all come from different places and different backgrounds. God has brought us together, called each of us and given us different gifts. But Christ is the head and cornerstone. Our focus must be on Christ and the Kingdom's work which He places before us. When we instead focus on personal differences, likes and dis-likes the church suffers and we are not growing and moving forward. As I shared last week "United We Stand" divided we fall. I know sometimes it's hard to put aside personal agendas but for the sake of the church, the family called Peace Lutheran we must.

What a blessing it has been to be your pastor this past twelve years and see firsthand how God works, blesses and uses each of you and myself to accomplish His will. What a joy to see you come together working to hold events like the Shrove Tuesday Pancake

Supper, the rummage sale, spaghetti supper, Oktoberfest and other events. I look back over the last 12 years and think how this church family has changed and grown. The focus is no longer on keeping the doors open but instead on how we can grow and be part of our community doing God's work being His witnesses as we share and live the Gospel.

My prayer is; as 2017 continues to unwind we can continue to move forward looking to Christ, united in Christ as brothers and sisters who have been called and gifted for His purpose.

January 9th 2017**

President Garry Kurth called the meeting to order and Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

Correspondence: None reported.

Minutes: Accepted.

Reports:

Financial Secretary: The fund summary was accepted.

Treasurers Report: The treasurer`s report was accepted. Rita Cowan mentioned that the new copy machine is saving us \$50 to \$60 a month.

Pastor Terry thanked Rita for doing such a wonderful job.

Trustees Report: Linda Williams advised that Chet Rochette is willing to change the three windows. He provided 3 different styles of windows. Much discussion followed. It was decided that Linda Williams will ask the kitchen committee which style of window they want. The loop system should be installed tomorrow. Lastly, the light on the church front overhang was repaired. Linda does not know who repaired it.

SCRIP: December's profit was \$77.13. The total profit for the year was \$774.16

Elders: Doug O'Hara advised that members Gloria and Duane Robinson have requested a peaceful release from the church. Doug advised that he is granting their release.

Pastor's Report: Pastor advised that we will be receiving four new members to the church on January 29th. They are Jerry and Rita Cook, and Dennis and Jae Ann Witzgall. We have three frozen turkeys that were donated to the church. After discussion, it was decided to donate the turkeys to the Covenant House. Pastor reminded us that our circuit will be hosting a mission convocation on Saturday the 21st at St. John's

Lutheran Church in Ocala. We have eight members who will be going. Pastor also advised that Shrove Tuesday is February 28th. Ash Wednesday is March 1st. This will be followed by five Lenten services on March 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th, and April 5th. Maundy Thursday is April 13th, Good Friday is April 14th and Easter on April 16th. Trina Ruttinger will be confirmed on Palm Sunday.

New Business

Shrove Tuesday. On February 28th We will be having our annual pancake supper. The cost will be \$7.00 per person and will be held from 4:30 to 7:00. Becky Williams will make the tickets, Rita Cowan will get the food, and Linda Williams will post a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board for volunteers.

Rummage Sale: Linda Williams stated that since LWML does most of the work for the rummage sale, she will bring this issue up at the next LWML meeting. Discussion was tabled until the next council meeting in February.

Church Office Computer: The computer is not able to connect to the internet. It is a very outdated computer. There was discussion whether we should repair or rebuild it. Linda Williams made a motion to purchase a new computer. Hope Kurth seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Since Rita Cowan is the primary user, she will speak with the computer store salesman and make sure the new computer has everything we need. Ron Cowan made a motion to adjourn. Linda William seconded. The meeting closed with the singing of the Doxology.

Scrip Program

For the past several years Peace Lutheran Church has chosen the Scrip Program as a fund raiser. The best part of this program is that the “user” has the ability to choose whatever “gift cards” they want. We have a Retailer List attached to the bulletin board with over seven hundred vendors. We also have blank forms on the bulletin board with approximately thirty vendors.

You can start this Program by going on line at Shopwithscrip.com/ and fill out a simple form registering you in the Program so that you can place your orders on line. Or, if you don't like to use the computer, you can use the paper forms. You can add as many vendors to the bottom or back of the form as you need. Then, on Scrip Sunday, all you have to do is

give me a check or cash for the amount you have purchased.

Using Wal Mart as an example, this is how it works:

Wal Mart cards come in \$25.00 or \$100.00 amounts. Order \$100.00 and Scrip will pay 2.5% of the \$100.00 order to our Church and give you the full \$100.00 on your card.

Each company, (vendor) decides their own percentage, which varies from 1.5% to 14%. If you are going to spend \$100.00 at WalMart that week, why not get their card and help raise funds for the Church? Or, if you are going out to eat out, say at Chili's, they pay 11% to the Church.

When you give me your check or cash, I make out a deposit slip to the Bank and the money is deposited directly to Scrip. after Scrip processes the order, they deposit the percentage due for the entire order in the Peace Scrip account. Fed Ex delivers the cards to my home on Thursday and I give them out the following Sunday.

It is an easy process and anyone who wishes to may order at any time. It costs nothing to register on-line and you may view and copy their vendor list to be available as you decide which cards you require. Your cards do not expire and you do not have to order a minimum amount or every time.

Why not try using the paper form first.

Remember, I am only a phone call away (465-5989) or see me any Sunday after Church. The web site I referred to has more information and they even accept phone calls from prospective members to answer any questions you may have.
