Meeting

September 12, 2016

Present: Sheryl Lutz, Jan Barker, Rita Cowan, Rebekah Williams, Doug O'Hara, Bud Koehlinger, Bob Sullivan, Ron Cowan, Jackie Hucker, Steve Cassan, Liz Koehlinger, Rev. Terry McKee.

President Sheryl Lutz called the meeting to order and Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

Correspondence: We received a "Thank You" note from Romeo Elementary School for our donation of backpacks. Also received was a request from the "Traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall" for a donation. Lastly, Bud mentioned that October is Pastor Appreciation month.

Minutes: The minutes from the August 8 meeting were accepted.

Treasurers Report: The treasurer's report was accepted.

Financial Secretary: The fund summary report was accepted.

Trustees: The trustees report was accepted.

Pastor/Elders Report: Pastor Terry advised that in our board meeting of May 2015 it was mentioned that the Church's financial reports should be available for everyone in the congregation. Much discussion followed. Becky Williams and Rita Cowan will meet and determine how to implement this by October 1 and then it will be discussed further. Pastor then advised that we have not done an annual audit. Rita Cowan will investigate if someone will do this for us and how much it will cost. Pastor Terry brought up, that at a former Congregational meeting; it was discussed that the Thrivent Choice Dollars percentage could be changed to 20%. It was tabled at that meeting. Becky Williams made a motion to keep the current Choice Dollars percentage at 10%. Bob Sullivan seconded the motion. The motion passed.

SCRIP: No report.

Old Business: Sheryl asked what we should do with the profit from Oktoberfest. It was decided to wait until we know how much money it will be. fifty-one backpacks have been delivered to Romeo Elementary school. The smoke detector issue is addressed in the trustees report. Regarding the blood drive, Steve Cassan has made a phone call to Life South regarding their request for a blood

drive at our church. Steve has not gotten a return phone call.

New Business: Regarding Food 4 Kids, It was noted we have not found a replacement for Jan Barker to represent our church. We have been removed from their packing list. Pastor Terry asked if Jan Barker could write a report in the newsletter regarding this.

The Nominating Committee is set up, but we still need one more member from the congregation. It was voted on and passed to change the Congregation/Voters meeting to November 20, 2016 due to the Thanksgiving Holiday. Bob Sullivan advised that Liz Koehlinger suggested buying permanent signs for our "Oktoberfest" which would not show a date. We could state on the sign that it will be "Friday" and put the sign on display the Sunday prior so that the "date" does not need to be changed from year to year. It was also discussed having permanent signs made for our "Spaghetti Super" and our "Potato Pancake Super".

Presidents Report: Pastor McKee will be on vacation from October 15, 2016 thru October 21, 2016. Pastor Scheer has been called to see if he can fill in on Sunday October 16. There has been no response from Pastor Scheer thus far.

Doug O`Hara made a motion to adjourn. Bob Sullivan seconded the motion. The meeting closed with the singing of the Doxology.

WhoWhatWhereWhyWhenHow?

We are nearing the end of the Church Year at the close of November. For this month of October, the green paraments on our altar and pulpit continue to remind us of our growth in Christ as we study His Word as He ministered to His followers. We will use red hangings on Reformation Sunday, October 30. Let's plan on wearing red that Sunday!

When Martin Luther nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517, to protest the practices of the church, it was not his intention to begin another church and certainly not to have it become known as "Lutheran". He

merely wished to debate his discussion points. He wrote lyrics or translated 32 hymns, many of which are in our Lutheran Service Book; wrote a Catechism of church doctrine in the form of questions and answers to assist parents in teaching their children; and translated the Bible from the Latin to German in order that everyone could read it, not only the priests.

There are a few other feast days and days which can be commemorated during the month. If we choose to emphasize the martyrdom of Jesus' brother James of Jerusalem, we would do that on Sunday, the 23rd, in which case the paraments would be red, the color of blood-shed in the name of our Savior.

Two other special occasions are also celebrated here at Peace. The entire month of October is Pastor Appreciation month. One Sunday will be LWML Sunday. On that Sunday, the ladies of Peace serve as ushers, greeters, acolyte and reader. The ladies of Peace are encouraged to wear purple on LWML Sunday.

Several times during the month of September, our Scripture readings used the word "fear", being in fear of God. The meaning of this word does not mean terror or being afraid in the sense of those readings, but rather that we are in awe of God and His power. Another phrase that may have caught your attention was in Hymn 686, "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing", where stanza two begins "Here I raise my

Ebenezer..." Huh? There's no time to check out the small print below the hymn as we sing on and it may have caused you to wonder just what in the world we were singing about! "Ebenezer" means "Thus far has the Lord helped us" and was the name given to the stone of remembrance that Samuel raised to God's glory. No, it doesn't mean we may now throw stones!

This is a good time to remind everyone that there is a website available to check pronunciation of names, places and things in the Bible.

I want to encourage our Sunday readers to consult this user-friendly site to be certain they are pronouncing the names of Bible books, people and places correctly. As my dad used to say, "You are putting the em-FAH-sis on the wrong syl-LAH-bul! I have done it myself. The funniest was when I was a teenager. I was reading the paper after dinner (don't know how I got out of doing dishes that night) and re-read an article three times without figuring out the subject matter. Usually, the context reveals that. I finally asked my mom what "a-DOLE-sent" meant. She didn't know either, until she read the article and told me I was mispronouncing "adolescent". Aha! Now it all made sense. My favorite mispronunciation in a Bible text is the word "Babel". Because of the confusion of languages described in the story of the tower, most people say

"babble", however, the correct pronunciation has nothing to do with babbling, but refers to the location, which is "BABE-el". I promise not to call anyone out on any words, but only mention this because I know that I get distracted when I hear them and am concerned that someone less familiar with Scripture may mispronounce words assuming if they hear them in church, they must be correct.
