President Sheryl Lutz called the meeting to order. Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

Correspondence: A letter was received from FLGA District, LCMS regarding "Operation Barnabas Task Force." President Sheryl Lutz stated she will make note of this letter in our April Peace Offerings Newsletter. Also received was a letter from Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries. Again, Sheryl will make a note of this letter in our April newsletter.

Minutes: The minutes were accepted for the February 8th meeting.

Treasurer Report: The report was accepted.

Financial Secretary: The report was accepted.

Trustees: Vic Rochette submitted his report. He checked with the Building Dept, and we cannot close off the egress door to Pastor's office. The new bookcase is on hold pending approval to move forward.

Vic was advised by the Building Dept. that the contractor who installed the sign should have received a letter from the Building Dept. by now to correct the defaults. The contractor will not be able to pull any more permits until this matter is resolved. The parking lot work is still in progress. Stop curbs have been repaired.

Automatic scheduling and advance notice of cost by E-Mail has been set up with Marion County Water Testing Lab. This quarter cost is \$105.00 and

is scheduled for April 11th. The Board of Trustees agreed to have a general monthly meeting on 3-14-16

Pastor`s Report: Pastor Terry advised that Vice President, Tom Victory just resigned immediately. Bud Koehlinger made a motion from the Elders that 9 new members be inducted into the church. Becky Williams seconded the motion. All were in favor. The new inductees are as follows. Ken Buschman, Peggy Buschman, Garry Kurth, Hope Kurth, Stephen Cassan, Sharon Cassan, Bob Orens, Don Conner, and Yvonne Conner. Pastor stated that at the end of 2015 we had 60 baptized members.

Pastor stated that he will be attending the Emergent Leaders Classes on the following dates. March 29th thru April 1st. April 19th thru April 21st. May 17th thru May 19th. There will be no Bible class on the Wednesday`s of these weeks. Also there will be no worship at Brookdale on these weeks.

Pastor spoke about our new church sign. He said it would be nice to have some graphics/pictures on the sign. He requested that someone with computer skills step up and try to figure out how to do this.

SCRIP: Our deposit for 2/21/16 was \$1285.00 and our profit for this order was \$43.17.

Old Business: LWML has decided not to do a bake sale on the day of our yard sale.

New Business: Boomtown Days will be held on April 16th. The LWML will have a bake sale and the men will hand out New Testaments. Becky Williams stated she called the Chamber of Commerce to see if they have a booth available for us.

Sheryl Lutz asked if we want to do our annual Spaghetti Dinner in May. Vic Rochette made a motion to have the Spaghetti Dinner on May 20th. Ron Cowan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion regarding members donating items such as plastic silverware, wine, etc. It was stated that some of these donated items are not exactly what we use. Sheryl Lutz will address this in the April newsletter. She will ask our members who wish to donate money, to use our "Designated Offering" envelopes stating specifically what they want their offering to be for.

**WhoWhatWhereWhyWhenHow?

Each time I type the title of this column, I think about sitting in

class working on a writing assignment and being so very careful to address each of the components indicated above in order that the contents would be complete. Hopefully, these articles do the same!

One Sunday in mid-March, two hymns had words which we don't use in every day conversation but that do relate to our understanding of our Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit. "Paschal" was the first. It is usually used in front of "feast", "candle", or "lamb". It is another word for Passover, which Jesus celebrated with His disciples, the "feast" we call the Lord's Supper. The Paschal candle symbolizes the Resurrection and stands inside the chancel area until Ascension Day. Jesus Christ is referred to as the Paschal Lamb. He is often depicted as a lamb with a halo, carrying a banner with a cross imposed on it.

The second word was "Paraclete". This Greek-based word means advocate or intercessor and refers to the Holy Spirit, who intercedes for us. We are now in the Easter cycle of the Church Year. The paraments remain white for six Sundays after Easter to continually remind us of Christ's purity and ours through His saving grace.

Wednesday, April 6th, is a day on which we may commemorate the life of the artist Albrecht Dürer. One of his most familiar paintings is of an elderly man praying over a loaf of bread. Dürer is listed in our service

book because he gave all glory and praise to Jesus Christ for his abilities. Monday, April 25th, is a Festival Day remembering St. Mark, the Evangelist. If his day falls on a Sunday, the paraments are red.

www.betterdaysarecoming.com is a good resource for the pronunciation of names of persons and places in Scripture and is very helpful if you are going to be reading the Sunday lessons. There is other interesting information on the site and you may want to spend a little more time acquainting yourself with it.

Our Alleluias have returned after being absent during the Lenten Season! He is Risen! Alleluia!
